Subject: Vehicle Type Inspection Requirements

This Technical Bulletin is intended to clarify the inspection requirements of heavy-duty vehicles. For safety inspection purposes, heavy-duty vehicles have GVWR'S of 10,000 and above.

To understand the requirements, there must be an understanding of the difference in definition between "vehicles" and "trucks". A "truck" is defined as "every motor vehicle designed, used, or maintained primarily for the transportation of property". This means a vehicle equipped to transport passengers is not a truck by definition even though the vehicle has been built on the same chassis as a truck. If a vehicle is not a truck and does not fit another definition such as bus, retired school bus, omnibus, etc., it is defined as a "vehicle".

An example of a "vehicle", which is often misidentified, would be a motor home with a GVWR of 20,000. Since these vehicles are on a truck or bus chassis, it would be reasonable to assume the vehicle is a "truck". The vehicle is actually considered a "vehicle". Another example of a vehicle, which is often misidentified, includes a Ford Econoline E-350 van equipped with seats to be a commuter van. This van is considered a "vehicle" by definition. The same vehicle equipped to transport a company's plumbing supplies is considered a "truck".
